HOW IT ALL BEGAN

FOUNDED ON A PRAYER

The YMCA was founded by a man named George Williams. In 1844, Williams left his family farm and began a life working in the drapery trade. He found factory life to be dreary and desperate. He looked around and saw young men struggling and living harsh lives. He began to pray alone in his factory dorm, asking God what he wanted him to do. Slowly, other boys began to join him in prayer, and the factory saw spiritual transformation through prayer first, then community. Williams then moved to London, still in the drapery trade, but with a new goal: To win young men for Christ. It was Williams' faith in action that brought the Gospel to London during the industrial revolution in 1844 and eventually led to what we now know as the YMCA. We want to see prayer transform our Y, our communities, and our city again! Welcome to our summer update. We are excited to share the latest news.



COMMUNITY PRAYER MEETINGS

In 2025, we have already seen the formation of three new in-person prayer meetings launching at the Elk River YMCA, the Emma B Howe Coon Rapids YMCA, and the Hastings YMCA. The Hastings YMCA community prayer meeting had its first gathering on June 12th! These prayer meetings focus on praying for each other, the YMCA, and their community, and we are excited to see how many people are embracing this new offering.



Y-PRAY

This is a bi-weekly email that features people's prayers! At the Y, we've had a dedicated prayer community that has faithfully prayed over requests from across our organization. We collect these requests through a QR code that allows us to minister to people from every corner of our Y. They have the option to remain anonymous, ask for a follow-up from a chaplain, and even join our prayer community.

PRAYER BOXES

In many of our Ys, there are prayer request boxes where people can submit handwritten prayer requests; these boxes are stewarded by a chaplain or a community volunteer.
